This week Shawn continued our new series, *We the Church* with a picture of what it looks like to be the actual Church in our everyday, ordinary lives. He reminded us that it is the movement of God and that we are invited to be part of it by making heaven more crowded, this is grace upon grace.

GROW

Read Acts 2:42-47; Hebrews 10:34-35; Ecclesiastes 4:9-12

This week, we looked at the early Church and we see what it means for the people of God to *be the Church* and how we can learn from the way the Gospel spread through them. Remembering the Church is not a place but a people that live out the Gospel in their words and the way they live their everyday, ordinary lives. The early Church devoted themselves to the Gospel and to each other by showing up, praying, being generous.

Shawn taught what this means for us as a family here at Red Rocks Church. We are invited to show up, pursue God in a group, be generous with your time and resources, serve each other while inviting others to participate in the wondrous love of God. The Church is at its most beautiful state when the people take the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus outside the buildings and serve those in their everyday interactions with people.

Read Matthew 16:18; 1 Corinthians 7:17

The life we have been given has been purposeful from the Lord and from the very beginning.
