Read Luke 15: 21-24

In this story, the Pharisees - religious leaders during Jesus' life - were upset because Jesus was pursuing tax collectors, sinners, and those who they deemed too far gone for God's grace. He told them this parable to demonstrate the love God truly has for each and every person. Jesus is giving us the assurance that when we turn back to God and put our faith in him, we are received with an abundant grace. You are celebrated, cherished, found, home. No matter if you're coming from the mountain top or rock bottom of life, you are safe to come exactly as you are.

What about the story of the prodigal son speaks to you?
What does it feel like to imagine yourself as the son and God as the father in this story?
What are moments in your life where you felt restored by God?

Read John 9: 1-12, & 24-25
☐ What stands out to you after reading this?
$\ \square$ What reactions or thoughts do verses 2-3 bring to you? Discuss with your group.
☐ The neighbors didn't recognize the blind man once Jesus restored his sight. Has God transformed a part of you in a similar way?
John 9 is a beautiful example of the fact that even if you can't see God working in your life he sees you. Even if you can't explain it fully, you are still fully known by Jesus. It might seem too good to be true, but God uses even the smallest seed of faith in you and he grows it. You start to recognize the ways God shows up in your life. The Holy Spirit works inside of you, guiding and transforming you through hardship. It's hard to find the perfect words to describe the feeling of knowing you're not alone anymore, but seen and loved instead. That is the power of a testimony. It is our own personal story - just like the blind man's - of how once Jesus got a hold of your heart, life was never the same.
